Creek Boys Tennis Records:

- Since 1972 Cherry Creek has won 47 out of 55 team state tennis championships
- Since 1972 There have been nine 4-time individual boys' state tennis champions. All of them come from our program: John Benson (class of 1977), Charlie Kettering (class of 1975), Willy Shafrroth (class of 1975), Brian Sullivan (class of 1977), Waste Krol (class of 1988), Brian Bigelow (class of 1988), TJ Moretto (class of 1996), Gregg Alpert (class of 1999), Connor McPherson (class of 2014)
- There have been four years that our program has swept all 7 individual positions in the State Championship: 1974, 1997, 1998 and 2013
- Boys Tennis alone would rank 15th in the state of Colorado for all-time total state championships won
- Since 1972 our program has never placed lower than 2nd in the team state championship
- Since 1972 we have had at least one state individual champion every year
- Harry Jewett (class of 2009) is the only player in our program to ever win a state championship final, 6-0, 6-0. He did so in 2007 at #3 singles
- Chad Harris (class of 2000) scored more team points than any player in the history of the team state tennis championship with 61 points. He was a finalist at #1 singles his freshman year, then won three consecutive #1 singles finals.
- The fewest games given up at the State Championship (four rounds of play) 1 singles- Ethan Hillis (2015)- 12 games
2 singles- Gregg Alpert (1999)- 11 games
3 singles- Mark Boren (2002)- 8 games
1 doubles- Brad Farber/JR Hagan (1998)- 9 games
2 doubles- Connor Macey/Alan Oakes (2007)- 10 games
3 doubles- Steven Kiffor/Zach Chernow (2007)- 5 games*
4 doubles- Gregg Alpert/Beau Berglund (1996)- 11 games

- Since 1972 our program alone has won 59% of the total individual state championships played (217 out of 370)
- Top percentage of state championships won during the four years of each graduating class
 1. 2000- 86% (24 of 28 state championships)
 2. 82% 1977, 1990, 2001 (23 of 28 state championships)
 3. 79% 1989 (22 of 28 state championships)
 4. 1978 78% (18 of 23 state championships)
 5. 1988, 1991, 1999 75% (21 of 28 state championships)


STATE TOURNAMENT RECORDS

FOUR TIME INDIVIDUAL STATE CHAMPIONS

The Cherry Creek Boys' Tennis Team has numbered 218 state champions. Nine of them are the only players to win four consecutive titles in our state's top classification.

JOHN BENSON - CLASS OF 1977

... the first Colorado player ever to win four consecutive state singles championships, winning #3 Singles as a freshman and #1 Singles for the next three years. He was twice named to the U.S. Junior Davis Cup Team, and earned a No. 9 national ranking in boys 18s. He was a three-time All-American for Trinity University in San Antonio, Texas. He then joined the professional tour where he attained a world singles ranking in the low 200's and top-50 in doubles. He and his brother, David, founded the Benson Junior Tennis Camps in 1984. He was named USTA developmental Coach of the Year. He was inducted into the Colorado Tennis Hall of Fame in 2000.

CHARLIE KETTERING - CLASS OF 1975

... winning #2 Doubles as a freshman, #1 Doubles as a sophomore and junior with Willy Shafroth, and #3 Singles as a senior. He was an Assistant U.S. Jr. Davis Cup Coach in 1979. He later became the Cherry Creek boys' tennis coach during the 1980 and 1981 seasons leading the team to two state championships.

WILLY SHAFROTH - CLASS OF 1975

... winning #2 Doubles as a freshman, #1 Doubles as a sophomore and junior with Charlie Kettering (Willy and Charlie were the first players in the state to win four consecutive state titles) and #1 doubles as a senior Sophomore Bob Brown.

BRIAN SULLIVAN - CLASS OF 1977

... winning #2 Doubles as a freshman, #2 Singles as a sophomore and junior, and #3 singles as a senior. He holds a national record of winning 19 matches during his senior year with the loss of only 13 games. He won 30 6-0, 6-0 matches in his career. In addition, Brian was the first high school player to win a golden set (no points scored against him), and he did that twice!! After winning his second golden set, he was two points from a golden match, at 6-0, 5-0, when he lost a point! He later played two seasons for Cal-Irvine and two seasons at Arizona State where he was team-captain. Since then he has coached numerous players at the collegiate level as well as recreationally.

WATSE KROL - CLASS OF 1988

... won #4 Doubles as a freshman with Paul Saidy, #3 Doubles in his sophomore and junior years again with Saidy, and #1 Doubles as a senior with Chris Brown. He went on to play collegiately at Boise State University.

BRIAN BIGELOW - CLASS OF 1988

... won #2 Doubles as a freshman with Rick Grossman, #1 Doubles as a sophomore again with Grossman, #3 Singles in his junior year, and #2 Singles as a senior. Brian was a multi-sport athlete who played college hockey at Princeton University.

T.J. MORETTO - CLASS OF 1996

... won #4 Doubles with freshman Jerad Harbaugh, as a sophomore at #2 Doubles with Jerad Harbaugh, as a junior at #2 Doubles with Brian Tomz and as a senior at #2 Singles.

GREGG ALPERT - CLASS OF 1999

... has the most victories without a loss in the history of Colorado High School Tennis. As a freshman he won at #4 Doubles with Beau Berglund, as a sophomore at #2 Doubles with sophomore Frank Visciano, and his junior and senior titles were at #2 Singles. Greg played in one of the most epic matches in Creek history. He was down 2-5, 0-30 in the semifinals of the state tournament during his senior year and came back to snatch victory.

CONNOR McPHERSON - CLASS OF 2014

... youngest player to win a Varsity 1 match at #1 singles – he was 13 as a freshman when substituting in that position. He won as a freshman at #3 Doubles with junior Spencer Anderson, as a sophomore at #3 Doubles with senior Parker Danneberg and won his junior and senior years at #2 Singles.

INDIVIDUAL STATE CHAMPIONS

1. **DAVE BENSON** (57-4), class of 1974: two state titles; #1 Singles in 71/72 as a sophomore and junior 72/73 and a third place in #1 Singles in 73/74 as a senior. Dave led the Bruins to their first state championship in 1972. He played college tennis at Trinity University. His team made the finals of the NCAA tournament in 1977 losing narrowly to Stanford, 5-4. He was the MVP of his team that year. Dave captained the US Junior Davis Cup squad in 1978 and '79. He was the head coach of the Creek boys tennis team between 1985-1990 winning 6 consecutive state titles. He was inducted into the Colorado Tennis Hall of Fame in 2016.
2. **CHARLIE KETTERING** (75-1), class of 1975: four state titles; #2 Doubles with freshman Willy Shafrroth in 71-72, #1 Doubles with Willy Shafrroth as a sophomore and junior and #3 Singles as a senior.
3. **WILLY SHAFROTH** (75-1), class of 1975: four state titles; #2 Doubles with freshman Charlie Kettering, #1 Doubles as a sophomore and junior with Charlie Kettering, and #1 Doubles as a senior with senior Bob Brown.
4. **JOHN BENSON** (75-1), class of 1977: four state titles; #3 Singles as a freshman, #1 Singles as a sophomore, junior and senior.
5. **BRIAN SULLIVAN** (76-0), class of 1977: four state titles; (lost only one set as a player in four years); won #2 Doubles as a freshman with senior Mark Freeman, #2 Singles as a sophomore and junior, and #3 Singles as a senior.
6. **MARK FREEMAN** (59-2), class of 1974: one state title in #2 Doubles with freshman Brian Sullivan.
7. **BOB BROWN** (68-0), class of 1977: three state titles; (lost only two sets in his high school career); won #1 Doubles as a sophomore with senior Willy Shafrroth, won #3 Singles as a junior, and #3 Singles as a senior. As a freshman Bob was 12-0 in #3 Doubles but it was not an event at the state tournament.
8. **DAVID BOWMAN** (19-0), class of 1975: one state title at #2 Doubles as a senior with freshman Ken Mason.
9. **KEN MASON** (74-2), class of 1978: two state titles; #2 Doubles as a freshman with senior Dave Bowman and #2 Doubles as a sophomore with senior Paige Bodine.
10. **PAIGE BODINE** (19-0), class of 1976: one state title in #2 Doubles as a senior with sophomore Ken Mason.
11. **MIKE MURRAY** (36-0), class of 1977: two state titles; #3 Doubles as a junior with junior Bill Whistler in 1975 (the first year #3 Doubles was a state event), and #2 Doubles as a senior with Bill Whistler.
12. **BILL WHISTLER** (35-1), class of 1977: two state titles; #3 Doubles as a junior with junior Mike Murray and #2 Doubles as a senior with Mike Murray.

13. **DAVID FRIEDMAN** (67-8), class of 1980: one state title in #3 Doubles as a freshman with sophomore Rich Levine.

14. **RICH LEVINE** (56-2), class of 1979: three state titles; #3 Doubles with freshman David Friedman as a sophomore, #1 Doubles as a junior with senior Harold Carrizo, and #3 Singles as a senior.

15. **HAROLD CARRIZO** (18-1), class of 1978: one state title in #1 Doubles as a senior with junior Rich Levine. Their only loss was to Littleton's Ken Fleck and John MacGowan whom they went on to defeat in district and state after a dual meet loss.

16. **STEVE BRAINERD** (19-0), class of 1978: one state title in #2 Doubles as a senior with junior Dan Washburne.

17. **DAN WASHBURN** (37-1), class of 1979: two state titles; #2 Doubles as a junior with senior Steve Brainerd, and in #1 Doubles with Alan Mayer when both were seniors.

18. **RICK VANDENBERG** (75-4), class of 1981: three state titles; one in #3 Doubles as a freshman with senior Steve List, and two in #2 Singles as a junior and senior.

19. **STEVE LIST** (19-0), class of 1978: one state title in #3 Doubles as a senior with freshman Rick VandenBerg.

20. **ALAN MAYER** (18-1), class of 1979: one state title in #1 Doubles as a senior with senior Dan Washburne.

21. **MARK HONNEN** (57-0), class of 1981: three state titles; one in #2 Doubles as a sophomore with Tom List, one in #1 Doubles as a junior with sophomore Art Quinn, and one in #3 Singles as a senior (after being down four match points in the finals to Tom Mattheson of George Washington).

22. **TOM LIST** (19-0), class of 1979: one state title at #2 Doubles as a senior with sophomore Mark Honnen.

23. **JIM UNGAR** (39-1), class of 1980: two state titles; one in #3 Doubles as a junior with senior Andy Freeman and one in #3 Doubles as a senior with senior Peter Ludwig.

24. **ANDY FREEMAN** (19-0), class of 1979: one state title at #3 Doubles as a senior with junior Jim Ungar.

25. **GEORGE SPISKA** (72-3), class of 1983: three state titles; as a freshman at #3 Singles and as a junior and senior 82/83 at #1 Singles. George lost in the finals of #1 Singles his sophomore in three sets, finishing 2nd. He went on to play college tennis at CU-Boulder.

26. **ART QUINN** (56-1), class of 1982: two state titles; in #1 Doubles as a sophomore with junior Mark Honnen and as a junior with junior Scott Hagan. Art was 2nd as a senior at #2 Singles. Art was named Creek's Head Boys Tennis coach in 2015. His teams have won 7 state championships as of 2025. He won the Tennis Industry Association (TIA) Coach of the Year Award in 2018.

27. **ROBERT PULVER** (21-0), class of 1980: one state title in #2 Doubles with sophomore Scott Hagan as a senior.

28. **SCOTT HAGAN** (58-1), class of 1982: two state titles; #2 Doubles as a sophomore with senior Rob Pulver and #1 Doubles as a junior with junior Art Quinn.

29. **PETER LUDWIG** (20-1), class of 1980: one state title in #3 Doubles as a senior with senior Jim Ungar.

30. **DAVID ROEHM** (18-0), class of 1981: one state title as a senior in #2 Doubles with sophomore Pat Shafrroth.

31. **PAT SHAFROTH** (62-0), class of 1983: three state titles; as a sophomore in 80/81 at #2 Doubles with senior David Roehm, as a junior with senior Benji Barton at #1 Doubles, and as a senior at #2 Singles in. His freshman year he was part of the undefeated Centennial League #4 Doubles team, but there was no #4 Doubles competition at state that year.

32. **VINCE CONNELLY** (50-1), class of 1983: two state titles; one as a sophomore with junior Greg Couch at #3 Doubles and one as a senior with senior Tom Bowman at #2 Doubles.

33. **GREG COUCH** (36-2), class of 1982: one state title as a junior with sophomore Vince Connelly at #3 Doubles.

34. **BENJI BARTON** (19-0), class of 1982: one state title as a senior with junior Pat Shafrroth at #2 Doubles.

35. **JIM SARGENT** (30-0), class of 1983: one state title as a senior at #1 Doubles with junior Brock Newby. As a junior was a district champion at #4 Doubles with senior Dag Folger when there was no state event.

36. **BROCK NEWBY** (41-2), class of 1984: one state title as a junior at #1 Doubles with senior Jim Sargent. As a sophomore he was part of the Centennial League undefeated #4 Doubles team (when there was no state event).

37. **TOM BOWMAN** (18-0), class of 1983: one state title as a senior with senior Vince Connelly at #2 Doubles.
